

## American Born Chinese Comic Analysis Discussion

**Directions:** About every other day you will select a specific page or spread from *American Born Chinese*. All you need to do is have at least 1 page ready to show the class for discussion and at least 2 topics of discussion for that page. Do NOT panic – this assignment is an easy way to get points. Just complete the assignment, work hard in class, and come to OP for help. And, the discussions are only 5-10 minutes long. To help you get started, I have listed some discussion requirements, sample ideas, and rubric for the discussion below.

### Analysis Discussion Requirements:

1. Select an interesting page
2. Have at least 2 planned topics for discussion
3. Use comic language when talking with your peers (panel, gutter, coloring, etc.)
